Mr. Hightower read the GM report as posted in the Board packet.

No further comments or discussion.

- 7.) Discussion and review of 2023 capital improvement projects to be funded with bond proceeds– Hightower

Mr. Hightower stated that the District had received the draft agreement back from SPI Engineering with the attorneys comments being approved. We are currently waiting for the full contract to be approved and we would be moving ahead with an elevated tower.

No further questions or comments & no action necessary.

- 8.) Discussion and possible action related to approval of Fiscal Year 2023 Financial Audit Report – Hightower

Mr. Hightower stated that the audits are close to being finished up. 2023 calculations are complete and they have moved into 2024 with no reported issues. Auditors are looking to close by the end August, pending no issues.

No further comments or discussion.

- 9.) Discussion and possible action regarding sale of District property (Bastrop County Parcel R# 62318) to Texas Rural Water Association – Hightower

Mr. Hightower presented a proposal from the Texas Rural Water Association to purchase approximately one acre subdivided from district property located on the corner of Tall Forest Drive and McAllister Road. The proposal consists of in-kind value, rather than direct monetary compensation, and is a combination of membership and equipment/property use. This includes a 5-year membership to TRWA, the use of a 100kw generator (\$2500-5000 approximate monthly value), use of TRWA's on-site training facility, and access to TRWA's equipment once housed on-site. Mr. Hightower conveyed that this package has a value of \$90,000 or more.

The Board understood that the membership value may fluctuate annually, based on the number of District customers, and that it would be monitored by both entities. Mr. Hightower explained that the use of the training facility will help the District with internal training, through components offered by TRWA, and that this value would likely increase over time since TRWA is always looking for better ways to serve their membership by offering different training styles and options. The Board discussed the package and confirmed that the overall in-kind compensation represents fair market value for the property.

Mr. Hightower also explained that the District would be putting in a driveway on the west side of the property, for access to both the District and TRWA facilities that would later be extended to make a circle drive connecting it with the driveway on the east side of the property. This would make it easier for large truck deliveries and for pulling equipment through. The District would grant an easement to TRWA for use of the driveways and areas that could be used for overflow parking as needed for training events. The Board agreed to allow full property access and easement as needed.

No further comments or discussion.

Mrs. O'Hanlon called the question.

Motion: Ron Whipple moved to approve the sale and easement to TRWA in exchange for the in-kind compensation package as presented.

Staff shared what information we had available, regarding the ASR meetings on-going with Bastrop & Austin Water. Mr. Hightower stated that both he and President O'Hanlon had been attending meetings regularly. The City of Austin is still putting together their final notes, for presentation to entities. They and/or staff, will be presenting a formal agreement to the Board, in October or November, to enter the

test phase. Any further information would be brought back to the Board, as received.

6d. Employee & Administrative update:

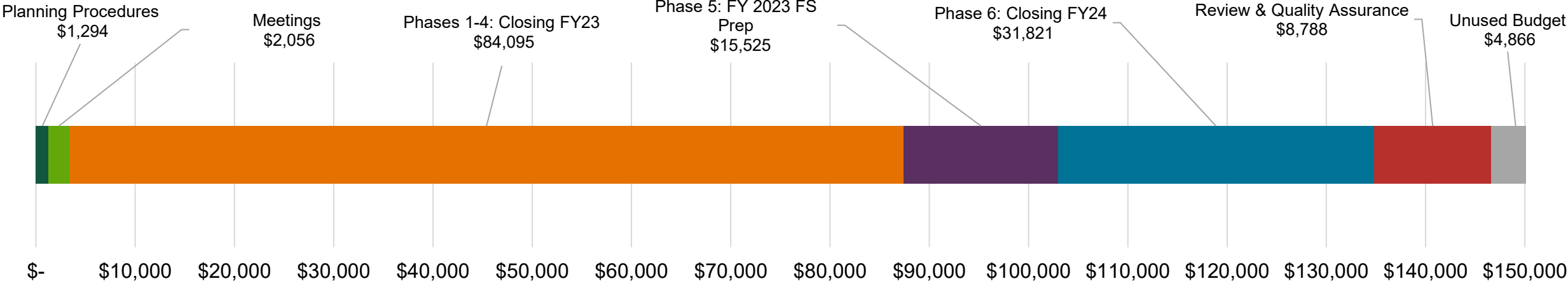

AQUIFER STORAGE AND RECOVERY



PROJECT OVERVIEW

what

Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) is a proven method of safely storing water in an aquifer to use later.

why

An ASR project is one way to meet water needs in the future. ASR will make water supplies more resilient during times of water shortage and emergencies. Additionally, an ASR project effectively eliminates water loss due to evaporation, stretching water supplies even further.

who

Working with local Bastrop County stakeholders, Austin Water is working to move forward with a 3-year laboratory study.

where

After extensive research in multiple Counties and aquifers, a portion of the Carrizo-Wilcox aquifer was identified as the best suited to test for an aquifer storage and recovery project.

when

To determine whether an ASR project is compatible and safe for Bastrop County and the portion of the Carrizo-Wilcox aquifer, a 3-year laboratory-based study is the next step, proposed to begin in late 2025.

how

The 3-year study will test water compatibility in a lab, not in the ground. The ASR project will not move forward without first determining the safety of the project.

PARTNERSHIP APPROACH

Austin Water is working with stakeholders in Bastrop County to develop protections and benefits for the Bastrop County community through this project. We want to hear from Bastrop County residents to help us find the best solutions, together.

While the challenges in our communities might differ, we are all connected by our most precious resource, water. Austin wants to work together with our Bastrop County neighbors as we all plan for Central Texas' future water needs.

PHASE 1B: FIELD TESTING

Our ask right now is simple: Allow us three years to study water compatibility and show that we're good neighbors you can trust. During the field-testing phase Austin Water will:

- **Include input** from the ASR Technical Advisory Group about testing methods and criteria
- **Share test results** with the ASR Technical Advisory Group, Bastrop County stakeholders, and the public.
- **Continue to engage** in a collaborative process.
 - Bastrop County stakeholders will have a voice in the decision-making process.
 - After receiving test results, the ASR Technical Advisory Group, Bastrop County stakeholders, and Austin Water will make recommendations to Austin City Council about whether the project should continue to the next phase.

PHASE 2: PILOTING

If the project proceeds to Phase 2 Piloting, Austin Water will:

- Share the testing plan before putting water into the aquifer.
- Show water test results to the ASR Technical Advisory Group and ask for their feedback.
- Study how nearby wells may be affected by the project.
- Create a plan to fix any problems caused by the project and set aside money to pay for those fixes.

PHASE 3: FULL-SCALE IMPLEMENTATION

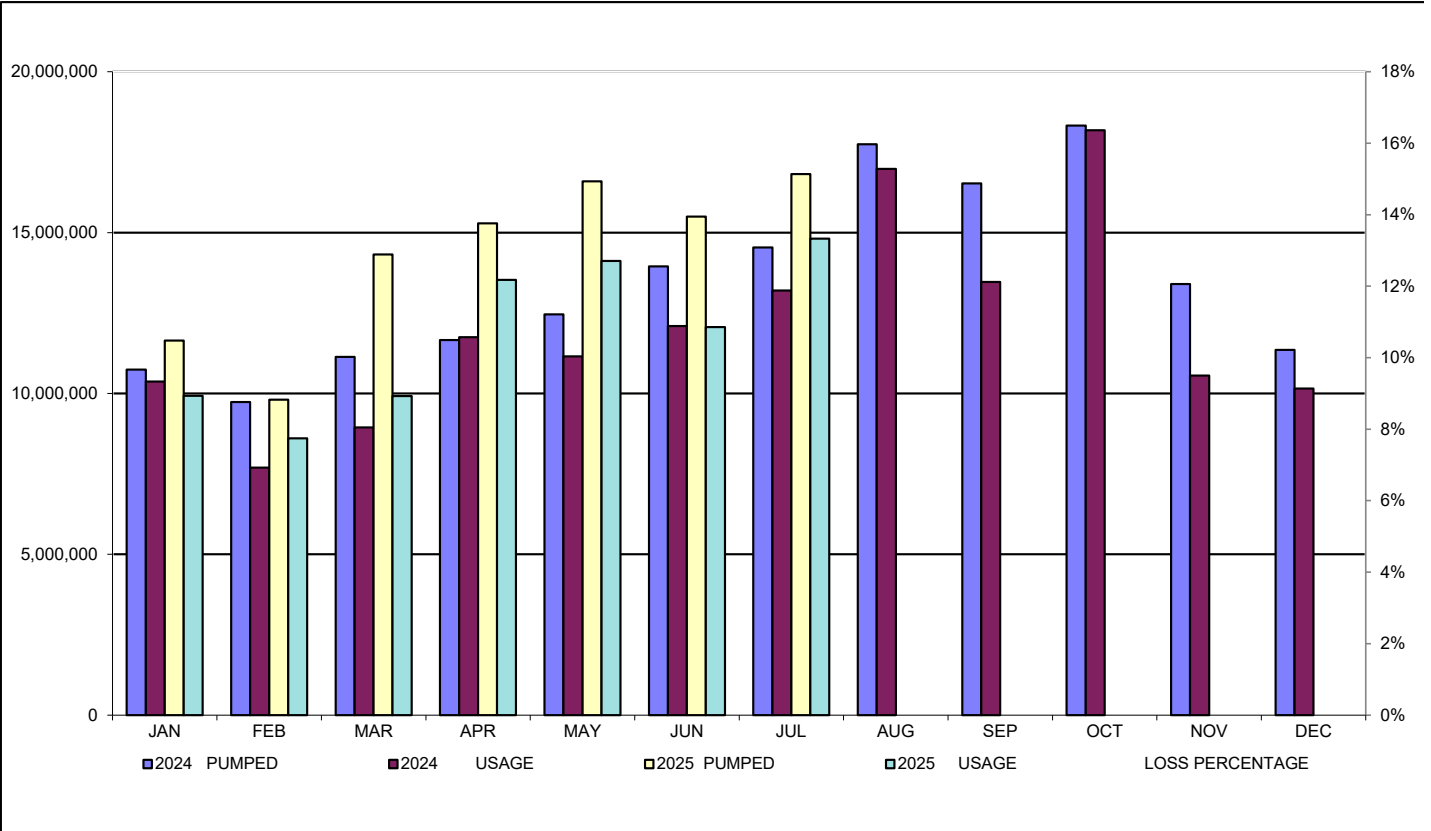
If the project proceeds to Phase 3 Full-scale ASR implementation, Austin Water will:

- **Work to protect the Bastrop County community and the aquifer by:**
 - Adding more water than is taken out.
 - Following and maintaining all safety and water laws per the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and the federal Safe Drinking Water Act.
 - Establishing a quarter-mile buffer zone around the wellfield to help keep the water added by Austin from mixing with local groundwater.
 - Planning for and addressing any impacts on nearby wells.
 - Paying landowners fairly and allow families to continue ranching and farming operations.
 - Sharing water quality and well data.
- **Support the community by:**
 - Creating a local education center.
 - Exploring the creation of grants for local communities and organizations.
 - Exploring the possibilities of parks and trails on land used for the project.
 - Making a certain amount of water available for Bastrop County partners to buy.
- **Refrain from using eminent domain** to acquire property for this project in Bastrop County.
